Because the Civil War was the first American conflict to be immortalized through photography, you will be researching the war and its impact through those very photographs. Select photos that are appealing to you or have a particular impact as you view them.

Use OpenOffice and save as a Word Document (.doc) or use Pages and export as a Word Document (.doc). In the file menu, select "Save as" in OpenOffice or "Export as" in Pages. Upload through Edmodo, using the approved naming protocol.

To save a photo on a Mac, go to its page (not just where the image is presented through an image collector like google images). Hold down the control key and click. You will see an option to save the photo. You can then import it into your document. Select one photo to meet each of the following requirements. Find out the information requested for each photo you select. *If you cannot find out the information, select a different photograph*. You will lose points for not completing all portions of the required information.
